



IMPORTANT SALE FACTS

Thank you for your entry into the 2017 Triangle Summer Sale. Please carefully review the following sale rules and procedures. If you have any questions, contact us at (405) 275-2196.

THE SALE OFFICE WILL BE OPEN AT 8:00 AM DAILY, FRIDAY, AUGUST 11, AND SATURDAY, AUGUST 12. CHECK IN AT THE SALE OFFICE WHEN YOU ARRIVE.

ORIGINAL REGISTRATION DOCUMENTS

Unless you have already forwarded these to the sale office they are due **NOW**, and before your horse can sell.

- 1) Original certificate of registration
- 2) Properly completed transfer form
- 3) Properly completed stallion service certificate or stallion owner guarantee for any mare selling "in foal". A form is included for use and/or reference. We will withhold any funds due until all such documents are delivered.

Additionally:

You must notify us of any necessary changes to original certificates of registration regarding color, markings, added brands, or gelding status.

ORIGINAL COGGINS AND HEALTH CERTIFICATE

- 1) Original negative Coggins test dated within six (6) months prior to the sale is required due to state health regulations varying nationwide. COPIES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE NOR ARE TEST RESULTS PRINTED ON A HEALTH CERTIFICATE.
- 2) Original health certificate dated within twenty (20) days prior to the sale is required.

DVD'S AND YOUTUBE LINKS

- 1.) **If you have submitted a YouTube link for the website, that link will be available for display while your horse is in the sale ring. All YouTube links must be submitted via EMAIL to info@jimware.net NO LATER than 12:00 pm CST on the Wednesday, AUGUST 9, PRIOR TO the first sale session**
- 2.) **If you bring a DVD of your sale entry to the sale please have the HORSE NAME AND LOT NUMBER clearly marked. We will assume the DVD takes priority over any other video and that DVD will be played while your horse is in the sale ring. Please make sure the DVD is at the point of play and that it works properly. TURN IT IN AT THE SALE RING VIDEO STATION located directly behind the auction box.**
- 3.) **TRIANGLE SALE STAFF MAKES ABSOLUTELY NO GUARANTEE THAT YOUR VIDEO WILL BE PLAYED AT THE TIME OF SALE IF YOU FAIL TO COMPLY WITH THESE TERMS.**

Cutters/Cow Horses \$70 For Live Cattle While Selling on Saturday, August 12

A custom cutting cow will be available in the sale ring for use during the sale on Saturday, August 12.

An additional track cow will be available in the make-up pen Friday and Saturday.

Roping Horses \$50 For Roping Demonstration (maximum 5 runs per horse) on Saturday, August 12 at 8:00 am

A "Smart Steer" and a "Perfect Calf" will be available during the day for use in the practice pen Friday and Saturday.

BROODMARE PREGNANCY STATUS

A veterinary certificate of "pregnancy" or "open" status, dated within twenty (20) days prior to the sale, must be submitted and on file in the sale office.

ENGAGEMENTS /ELIGIBILITES

Any special event eligibilities (not already listed in the sale catalog) should be indicated in writing at check-in for announcement during sale.

SALE LOT ORDER

Lot order for each sale session was sorted alphabetically by using the first letter of the second dam's name. The first letter for the sale order was determined then all others fell in place sequentially. Grade horses were lotted by substituting their names for the second dam's name. A draw for the first letter was made at Triangle Sales office and the result was the letter "D".

When multiple horses with the same dam/second dam were drawn back to back, owners may have requested they be moved forward or backward ten lots in the daily order.

Lot order for special productions/dispersals within a sale was determined by or on behalf of the owner.

CATALOG PAGE ACCURACY

The entire catalog is posted on our website at www.trihorse.com. You will also be mailed a catalog to the current address we have on file for you. PROMPTLY NOTIFY THE SALE OFFICE OF ANY CORRECTIONS PRIOR TO THE SALE. YOU ARE THE SOLE GUARANTOR OF ALL CATALOG INFORMATION.

STALLING

Stalls will be available Friday, August 11, at 8:00 am. If you need to arrive earlier, please contact the sale office for arrangements.

Please check-in at the sale office upon arrival for your stall assignments and hip numbers. Stall cards and first bedding will be furnished (additional bedding may be purchased through the sale office). No straw or hay bedding is allowed by the Expo Center. Bring your own buckets, feed and hay.

SALE DAY RESPONSIBILITY

It is your responsibility to get your horse to & from the auction arena. Handlers are available to lead your horse if needed.

WARRANTIES

Warranties and limited warranties are as stated in the consignment contract and the Sale Terms posted in the sale catalog. **IN THE EVENT YOUR HORSE POSSESSES ANY FAULT, DEFECTS OR CONDITIONS STATED, IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO INFORM SALE MANAGEMENT IMMEDIATELY SO THAT PROPER ANNOUNCEMENTS MAY BE MADE. ANY VARIATION OF THIS POLICY ALLOWS BUYERS TO RETURN HORSE(S) WITH FULL REFUND. Owners are warned that any horse refused by the Buyer for lack of disclosure of any warranty or limited warranty described in the Sale Terms will be subject to return. Upon any such return, the consignment fee plus the greater amount of the 8% commission or \$1,000.00, will be owed.**

PRIVATE SALES COMMONLY REFERED TO AS "ALLEY SALES" ARE NOT PERMITTED

Every owner has entered into a contract to sell each horse cataloged at auction. This authority is irrevocable, thus no horse may be sold privately before it is offered publically. If a horse is "repurchased" or "passed-out" in the auction arena, the private sale of that horse is encouraged provided all settlements are made directly to the sale cashier.

AUCTION ARENA GUESTS

Liability and strict auction policy allows no person(s) in the auction arena while a horse is selling except representative(s).

ANNOUNCEMENTS/OWNER PARTICIPATION

Owners are asked to please refrain from personally using the auction PA system to comment as a horse is selling. Diligent attention and great expense has been made to secure extremely qualified announcers and auctioneers at the sale. If an owner has additional details to add in the sale of a horse, it may be done by submitting a written note for announcement or commenting clearly to the professionals on the auction block for announcement.

UPSET BID

Unless waived by announcement, there shall be a minimum "upset (starting) bid" of \$500.00 for any horse presented for sale. If the "upset (starting) bid" is not received, the horse shall be automatically repurchased by the owner as unsold and all expenses become due by owner to sale management, thus no horse will be sold for less than \$500.00.

OWNERS RIGHT TO BID

This auction is conducted "with reserve", meaning the right to bid is reserved by the owner. To protect the desired sale price for the horse, owner, or its authorized agent must:

- a. be the final bidder on the horse and execute the Buyers Acknowledgement Of Purchase And Security Agreement OR
- b. **COMPLETE AN OFFICIAL AUCTIONWARE LLC RESERVE BID FORM ON THE AUCTION BLOCK, WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF A SALE STAFF MEMBER, WITHIN 5 LOTS PRIOR TO THE SALE OF THE HORSE OR**
- c. complete an official AuctionWare LLC reserve bid form in the sale office, with the assistance of a sale staff member, within 1 hour prior to the sale of the horse OR
- d. make known to the Auctioneer for announcement that the horse has been repurchased or passed-out BEFORE LEAVING THE AUCTION ARENA

Under procedures "b" and "c" above, AuctionWare LLC reserves the right to bid on behalf of the owner, or its authorized agent, up to the amount of the reserve bid amount.

TRANSFERS

The transfer fee is the responsibility of the owner and will be deducted from your sale proceeds.

HALTERS

A complimentary shipping halter and lead will be provided for each horse sold. Buyers may pick up halters in the sale office after full account settlement has been made. DO NOT leave the auction arena with our leather show halter.

ORIGINAL COGGINS AND HEALTH CERTIFICATE

ORIGINAL COGGINS AND HEALTH CERTIFICATE

- 1) Original negative Coggins test dated within six (6) months prior to the sale is required due to state health regulations varying nationwide. COPIES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE NOR ARE TEST RESULTS PRINTED ON A HEALTH CERTIFICATE.
- 2) Original health certificate dated within twenty (20) days prior to the sale is required.

A new Coggins test will be performed on any horse without an original test dated within six (6) months of the sale. Owner will be charged the current rate for this service from the local veterinarian who attends the sale.

RADIOGRAPH REPOSITORY INFORMATION SHEET

Owners:

1. A radiograph repository will be available for the benefit of owners and buyers. Participation is **VOLUNTARY**.
2. Asteris, Inc. will provide veterinarians with an online application for remote radiograph submission. Please have your vet visit www.trihorse.com or contact Asteris, Inc. (877) 727-8374, Extension 5 for information and assistance with the link to the application that will allow the submission of images from his/her system.

All radiographs must be submitted no later than 12:00 pm CST on Wednesday prior to the first sale session...AUGUST 9!

Given that horses can and do injure themselves, images may be added to the repository for an "area of concern", if the original upload has already been accomplished. A corresponding report from the veterinarian is required and the images must be added during the regular submission date range.

Owners will be held responsible for associating radiographs with the horse(s). If the horse name is changed in the radiographs knowingly or unknowingly, or if the images have been tampered with, the owner is responsible for any charges incurred from a dispute.

Veterinarians:

The following views are suggested:

Both front fetlocks: DP, flexed lateral medial

Both carpi: DLPMO, PLDMO (just off lateral), flexed lateral medial

Both hind fetlocks: DP, standing lateral medial

Both hocks: Just off DP 10 degrees (slight DLPMO), lateral medial, PLDMO

Both stifles: Lateral medial (getting the proximal tibia as well as the trochlear ridges of the femur and patella) and a plantar anterior as long as the condyles are visible

For horses 2 years and older it is also suggested to have:

the front feet radiographed 60 degree DP and Skyline

Please label the studies in this manner:

Patient = **Lot Number** as it is in the catalog AND **Horse Name** (AQHA Registered Name...NOT Barn Name) are required

Owner = **Consignor**, as listed in the catalog
